## **SUMMER SCHOOL**

- √ Registration began on April 10, 2012 and ends at noon on May 22, 2012 or when a class has reached enrollment capacity. Applications must be signed by a guidance counselor and then forwarded to the Office of Curriculum and Instruction.
- √ All classes are held at North High School.
- √ Classes begin at 7:00 a.m. and end at 12:00 noon.
- √ 1st session runs from May 29th through June 18th.
- √ 2nd session runs from June 20th through July 12th.
- √ NO ABSENCES ARE ALLOWED. Under emergency situations, students will be allowed make-up sessions for two absences. Tardies will require attendance at make-up sessions.
- √ A clinic will be open and staffed.
- √ All discipline policies of the Fort Zumwalt School District will be in effect during summer school.
- √ Dress code: No swim suits, sunglasses, see-through materials, tank tops, short shorts/skirts, low cut muscle shirts, halter tops, or clothing exposing undergarments. Shoes must be worn at all times.

Should you have any questions, please see your guidance counselor.

## **GUIDANCE NEWS**

This is the time of year when students' focus should be on successfully completing courses and earning credits for the semester. Seniors need to be especially mindful of satisfying graduation requirements.

Summer school will be held at North High for students who need to recover credit in certain core academic classes. Session I will be May 29th through June 18th. Session II will run from June 20th through July 12th. Registrations forms are available in the guidance office.

College-bound juniors are encouraged to take the ACT or SAT this spring. It is recommended that students take either the ACT or SAT at least once prior to their senior year. Register for the June 9th test online at [ww.actstudent.org](http://ww.actstudent.org) by May 4th to avoid a late fee. Register for the SAT at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com).

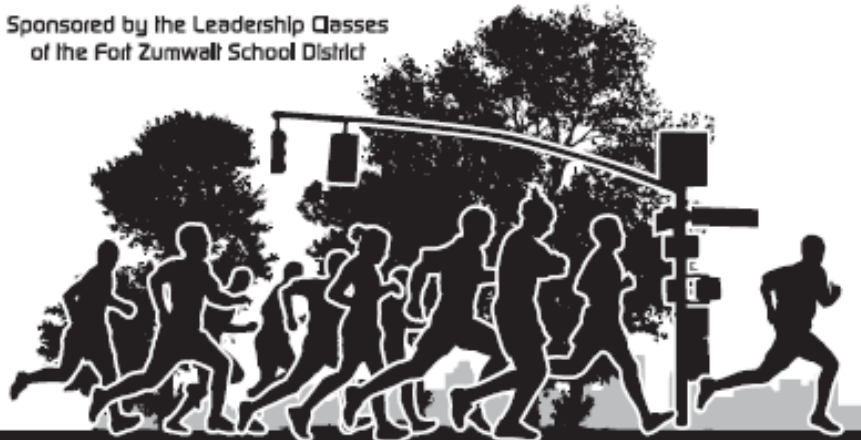
